oard of Directors activity: At the board meeting on March 18, I was elected chapter president. Thank you for the opportunity. We have completed some major stream work along with smaller river clean-ups (Sarah Sanford's Rush River CleanUp, and Trimbelle River tire removal). The chapter has begun using annual budgets to better plan and control spending, and developed a strategic plan. In some ways we are becoming a more professional organization.

Hans Jung was elected vice president. Gary Horvath and Allison Jacobs were re-elected treasurer and secretary, respectively. I believe that we have a strong team for the coming year.

The restoration project on the Trimbelle above Beldenville is on schedule. Many tons of rock have been delivered. The next volunteer work will be needed approximately in mid-summer, to build lunker structures and then mulching and seeding. Stay tuned.

Tree cutting is virtually complete along Parker Creek just below Cty Rd J, but there is still plenty of need for volunteers to pile brush and limbs. This one is not a large restoration project, but elimination of invasives, such as box elder, is important for the maintenance of the entire stream.

Letters are being mailed for the Hap Lutter Spring Appeal. This appeal and the auction at our banquet are the primary internal ways to fund the chapter, so both are important.
