Stream Improvement Update

MEETING NOTES

Forty-four chapter members braved the cryogenic cold of January 6th to hear area fish manager Doug Erickson discuss some revolutionary changes that may be in store for Wisconsin's trout fisheries.

Members gasped out loud to hear that a greater emphasis will be placed on warm water fisheries--although existing cold-water programs will continue. The DNR asserts that 90 percent of Wisconsin's fishermen prefer to fish for warm-water species.

In addition, future creellimit regulations may be tailored to individual streams: Streams overflowing with thousands of cigar-sized brookies would benefit from elimination of daily limits, while some trophy streams may need to be designated catch-and release only.

Future DNR stream management efforts may also rely more heavily on volunteer groups like TU for assistance.

You may not like the changes in store for our cold water fishery—but you have two years to get used to them (or to try to change them) before they go into effect in 1990.
