Winter Stream Improvement Plans Mapped

Kiap-TU-Wish is announcing a three-month stream improvement project that will begin in January. It's called Fishworks '88, and it's the first phase of a multi-year project aimed at rehabilitating the Kinnickinnic.

For years this lovely spring creek has been one of the best in the state, producing astronomical numbers of wild brown trout and prolific insect hatches. But the lack of maintenance is beginning to take its toll.

Downed trees, overgrown

banks and too much shade have clogged the stream and lowered its productive capabilities. But in January we're going to begin our efforts to reduce this process, and we'll start by attacking "The Jungle"--the stretch of river from the county farm down to its confluence with Parker's Creek (see map).

Our objective is to increase stream flow and light penetration to the stream bottom in this area.

We'll be removing deadheads and snags from the river, cutting and removing

standing dead timber and selected live trees where appropriate, and cutting and hauling brush from the stream bank. There will be work for everyone no matter what your age or frailties. To give you a better idea of what to expect, a short slide program will be shown at the January meeting.

Location:


Go three quarters of a mile south of County Road N on Orchard Road, turn east past the gray farm, then go a quarter of a mile to the river.

Dates:

January 9th and 23rd from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Dates in February to be announced.

What to Bring:
Waders, work gloves, warm clothes and coffee. We'll supply lunch. We also have cables, chain saws, hard hats and goggles. Bow saws and large pruners work best for brush. If you have a chain saw, bring it--we never seem to have enough.
