TROUT: A salmonid between 3 and 12 inches in length.

14" TROUT: A 12" trout.

"SEVEN POUND BROWN TROUT TAKEN ON A DRY FLY": A denizen of the same bestiary as the Easter Bunny, Pegasus and Babe The Blue Ox.

"THE VERY LARGE BROWN TROUT THAT RISE TO TRICOS ON THE DOWNSTREAM STRETCHES OF THE MAIN WILLOW": Carp.

"GOOD FISH": Any fish you land.

"BIG FISH": Any fish you hook, but don't land.

"A TROUT'S LIE": Usually involves two trout discussing a statement made by a third trout, e.g., "Then the jerk had the nerve to tell me that he was only looking for late season nymphs when he got between me and that big hen on the spawning redd she'd dug."

DRY FLY: See preceding entry.


STREAMER: An angler exclusively devoted to fishing moving waters, as opposed to a "LAKER".
