
As many of you know, the Willow and Willow-Race has suffered as a result of the work done removing the Burkhart dam and the repeated floods that have hit the Willow system every year for the past 5 years (at least!). The "Willow River Committee" lead by Ivan Schloff has taken the issue straight on and to the highest levels of the Wisconsin DNR. The bottom line is, the DNR is aware of the problems, and Kiap-TU-Wish continues to apply pressure to resolve the issues. *Ivan will be reporting at our meetings* on the issues and proposed solutions throughout the year and we'll talk him into writing a piece for the Rip-Rap to fill you all in (no pun intended).

Continued vigulance at the construction sites on the Kinni have minimized damage to the system but have not prevented it.
