Pocket Water Casts

in honor of The Ascerbic Angler

"As an artist, realizing how the intelligent use of color can give life to a picture, I feel that anglers are prone to neglect the possibility of using more living color in their flies. If an artist were to thoroughly mix certain colors to obtain a gray and then apply it to the canvas, the gray would be devoid of any lifelike quality. But, if he should apply the same colors directly to the canvas without mixing them beforehand, the result would have a great deal more vibration, light and life. At close range, the effect would be one of a mixture of colors. But at a slight distance they would appear close to the color and value of his original mixed gray, except that it would be alive and not dead. The flies used for so discriminating a fish as the trout should, first of all. have the appearance of life. I am convinced that a lifelike effect can never be obtained by using materials which lack that quality. Impressionism in the materials as well as in the form of flies offers great advantages because it is based on the principles and discoveries of the impression ist painters. As they studied the form which reflected or absorbed light and thus took on certain color qualities of its surroundings, they were dealing in life, not death. Anglers should do the same."
